Pentecost Sunday (Whitsunday) The fifty days of Easter conclude with this feastday which marks the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the disciples. They would be among the 'first fruits' of a new creation.

First Reading: Those gifted with the presence of the Holy Spirit are able to communicate the love of God to others, friend and foe alike. The language of Christian charity can be understood everywhere.

Second Reading: The Spirit of Christ in us means we can address God as "Abba" (the Aramaic word "dad"). We are called to honour the spiritual aspect of our lives.

Gospel: The Holy Spirit is our Advocate, the one who pleads our case before God and helps us to find our peace with God.
