### Fourth Sunday / Saint Brigid, Secondary Patron of Ireland

*First Reading:* Writing during the Exile, the prophet Zephaniah upended the traditional Jewish concept that only victory could be a sign of God's favour. The humble of heart and those who seek integrity will inherit the earth in the fullness of time.

*Responsorial Psalm:* The Lord helps the oppressed peoples of the earth.

*Second Reading:* For St Paul, the best wisdom that we can rely on in life is that which has been made visible in Jesus.

*Gospel:* The Sermon on the Mount lists eight ways we can find blessing in the Lord. It seems that different people gravitate to a different Beatitude. Which one is your favourite?

**Point to Ponder:** "Brigid, Patrick and Columba (the three national patrons of Ireland) were pillars in the young Irish church. Brigid was about ten when St Patrick died and, if historical dates are correct, Columba was about four when Brigid died, in 525AD. Within about a century, the faith of Patrick had taken hold in many parts of this island. Today we face a need for renewal of Church in our sad world. What were the key elements in the Irish form of Christianity that became a powerhouse of monasteries and missionaries over the following centuries? Saint Brigid and her friends had no idea how their ministry would work out. But they knew, as a document from the Synod on synodality puts it, "we affirm that the Church **is** mission" (Donal McKeon, Bishop of Derry).
