




# Parish of Killavullen and Annakisha

**Easter Sunday** “Christ has turned all our sunsets into dawn”

- Clement of Alexandria (150-215AD)

**First Reading:** Peter addresses Cornelius and his family with the *kerygma* (the proclamation) of the Good News of Jesus, what he said and did and how he rose to new life. By following him, we too will find new life.

**Responsorial Psalm 117:** A song of praise to God. We praise the Lord for conquering death in the resurrection of his Son. He was the stone rejected by the builders that became the cornerstone of a new covenant with God.

**Second Reading:** The Good News moves our hearts and minds to heavenly things. Through our baptism, we are “hidden with Christ in God.”

**Gospel:** Peter and John hear the Good News from Mary Magdalene. The empty tomb provided them with sure evidence for the resurrection.

## **From the Parish Liber Chronicus (annual record) 1989 (continued):**

- “Sr Bernadette was changed from the Nano Nagle Centre to return to her convent in Limerick. Sr Joseph Dermody and Sr Bridie were appointed to the Centre, in Ballygriffin.
- Fr James Christopher Burns CC died unexpectedly on 15<sup>th</sup> October 1989. Most Rev. John Ahern, retired bishop of Cloyne was chief celebrant at the Requiem Mass celebrated in Killavullen Church on October 18. A very large number of concelebrants and congregation gathered for the funeral. Bishop John Magee was unable to attend owing to a prior engagement in Rome with Pope John Paul II. His message of sympathy was conveyed to Fr Burn’s relatives, the people of the parish, and the friends of Fr Burns who had come from many parishes to offer their respect and sympathy.
- Fr Timothy O’Connor SPS, a member of the Kiltegan Fathers, was appointed curate in Killavullen Parish on 16<sup>th</sup> December 1989.
- Most Rev John Magee, Bishop of Cloyne, met newly ordained priests and students for the priesthood at Nano Nagle Centre.”
