Fifteenth Sunday

First Reading: Moses reminds the people that God is very close. When they keep the commandments God dwells in their midst.

Second Reading: Christ is now raised to a place of dominion as Lord of all creation. He has reconciled us to God through his death on the cross and his resurrection.

Gospel: Jesus accused the religious leaders of Israel of hypocrisy. While they observed the details of the religious Law (Torah), they missed its essence: compassionate love. The fact that it was a Samaritan who helped the Jewish victim of crime was most surprising.

- "Fr John O'Connor PP, Donoughmore (retired) came to live with his family in Killavullen. There was a concelebrated Mass of Thanksgiving for his Golden Jubilee of Ordination in Killavullen Church on June 14.
- Fr Daniel Linehan, formerly of Ballygriffin, who spent his life in Australia celebrated the Golden Jubilee of his Ordination (1938). A concelebrated Mass of Thanksgiving was offered in Killavullen Church on 18th August.
- A meeting was held on November 3 to make preparations to the mark (in 1989) the 150th anniversary of Killavullen Church. This meeting was originally scheduled on October 25 but was postponed due to heavy flooding on the roads."
