Young Christian Workers: A meeting will take place in Killavullen Church meeting room on Saturday, May 25 at 7.30pm. We will prepare a Mass for those studying for the Junior and Leaving Certs on June 1st at 7.00pm. All second level students are welcome to the planning meeting.

Annakisha Church: A survey of the church by PJ Barrett engineers (www.pjbarrett.ie) has noted damaging levels of humidity (typically 70-80%) in the interior atmosphere. 30-50% is considered normal, depending on the season. The high levels of humidity is caused by the soakage of rainfall through the walls. The moisture finds its way internally, rather than going back outwards (in dry weather) because a superficial cement pointing was applied to the stonework, trapping the water in the walls. This pointing was removed from the West facing facade in the last renovation, but remains in the three other walls. The most obvious consequence of the water ingress is the damaged plasterwork, evident at a number of points inside the church and the sacristy; another is the gradual dissolving of the designs in the largest stained glass window. Excessive humidity makes the church difficult to heat (dry air heats more quickly) and causes condensation on the walls and floor after heating. The retention of water is also undermining the potency of the mortar within the walls. Short term remedy: The window roundels will be kept open during the summer months to allow better ventilation of the damp air. The roundels will be repaired this week. Long term: remove the cement pointing and reinstate a lime-based mortar in the stonework so that all walls can emit moisture outwards. I am presently having this solution priced, initially for the south facing façade. (Fr. Gerard)
