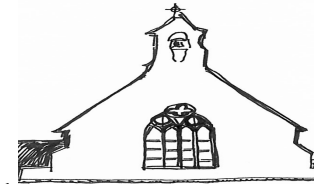

Killavullen Parish Pilgrimage to Glenstal on August 15: Booking forms are available at Churches, the Parish Office and members of the Pastoral Council. We have provided the option of travelling by coach from Killavullen and Annakisha churches, or by car. Arrival at Glenstal for Tea / Coffee at 10.30am. A monk of the Benedictine Community will lead a tour of the Abbey. At 12.10pm we will celebrate Mass with the monastic community for the Feast of the Assumption in the newly renovated Church of St. Columba. Dinner will be provided at the monastery. Parish Pastoral Council: Last week's meeting included a reflection on the opening rites of the Mass. We aim to create a joyful and welcoming atmosphere at Mass. Though we come together from a variety of backgrounds we are one family before the Lord. We encourage parishioners to arrive some minutes before Mass so as to spend some time in silent prayer and anticipation. The Mass is a gathering around the *Table of the Lord*: this sense is achieved by filling the seats from the front. The opening rites include a procession through the assembly (led by a cross and also including the bible) accompanied by a song. This part of the Mass concludes with the Opening Prayer, which includes a moment of silence as we all pray our intentions for that celebration.
