Annakisha Gable Wall: Work began this week on the inside portion of the gable wall behind the altar. In 2018 repairs to the parapet of this wall and to the adjoining sacristy roof have greatly reduced rainfall based water ingress to this part of the church. Now we can address the unsightly effects of the dampness: decayed plasterwork and peeling (oil-based) paint. All loose plaster and paint is being stripped away in preparation for a limebased mortar that will allow the wall to emit its moisture content without cracking. The wall and reredos will be painted later this Summer. Thank you for your financial contributions which enable us to complete this maintenance work. Registered parishioners who donate more than €250 annually can allow the parish to claim a tax rebate from Revenue: it is this scheme in particular that is funding the work at Annakisha. Forms to register with the parish are available at Church doorways and can be returned to the boxes inside church doorways.

Seeing your life through the lens of today's Gospel (John Byrne OSA)

1. The two sisters symbolize the contemplative and active dimensions of life, at times difficult to balance. What wisdom have you learned on how to strike a balance between prayer and action?
