Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. Today we celebrate an event in the early life of Jesus. In fulfilment of the Jewish custom, Mary and Joseph bring the child Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem, to present their firstborn to the Lord. One of the temple officials, Simeon, see in the child the longawaited Messiah. 1st Reading: The coming of the Messiah will be a gamechanger in human history. 2nd Reading: God became one-with-us in his Son, so that we could know the fullness of redemption. Gospel: Christian tradition has drawn on a phrase from the Song of Simeon ("a light to the nations") to bless the candles that will be used in the Church and in homes over the coming year. This ritual will take place at the beginning of Mass
