'Flu Season and the Sign of Peace: The following advice is adapted from the Archdiocese of Dublin website. Those with influenza symptoms are dispensed from their Sunday obligation to attend Mass. The sick or housebound can honour the Lord's Day by praying along with the Mass broadcast on parish webcams (eg., www.churchservicestv/Mallow) or on RTE Radio Long Wave 252 (RTE1 often broadcasts Mass on Sunday mornings). Please note that, Ministers of the Eucharist sanitize their hands during the Rite of Communion. The HSE has advised that: "Shaking hands while exchanging the 'Sign of Peace' involves a low risk of spreading the virus." If you feel uncomfortable about shaking hands at the Sign of Peace, you might wish others the Peace of Christ with a smile or a bow. It is not necessary to make hand contact
