Covid-19 Pandemic. We will be living with Covid 19 for the foreseeable future - every sensible precaution on our part will help suppress the virus. In relation to coming to Mass please make the following adaptations:

- Wash your hands before leaving home and on returning from Mass. Sanitize your hands on entering the church and as you leave. Consider wearing a mask / face guard while at Mass. Arriving to church early and leaving a few minutes afterwards will help avoid crowding at the doors as well as being an opportunity for personal prayer.
- Sit with your family group and two metres away from all other others. Make greater use of our front seats. Observe respiratory etiquette.
- Communion is to be received on the hand from the celebrant. Please observe social distancing in the communion procession. If you wish to wait on after Mass you can also receive communion at that time.
- Our churches are well ventilated and regularly sanitized thanks to the efforts of our sacristans, volunteer cleaners, and CE workers.
- If you decide not to attend Sunday Mass, please participate in Church life through live streaming services on radio, TV and the Internet. You might also consider coming to a weekday Mass.
