## Nineteenth Sunday: The Lord, the bringer of peace.

1<sup>st</sup> Reading: The Lord appears to the prophet Elijah not in storm, earthquake or fire, but in a gentle breeze. It is in moments of calm recollection that we are likely to hear the voice of God.

*Psalm* 84 R./ Let us see, O Lord, your mercy and give us your saving help. 2nd Reading: St. Paul is willing to make great sacrifices for his brothers and sisters in Christ.

Gospel: The calming of the storm on the Sea of Galilee is a symbol for the gift of peace that God can bring to our turbulent lives. We may, like Peter, have "little faith", but Jesus supports our best efforts to be strong.

Covid-19 Pandemic and Public Masses. The August 10 full reopening of Churches has been shelved owing to the ongoing threat posed by the virus. We are now adapting to a "new normal" for the medium term. Our liturgies have become simpler and are in some ways more dignified and meaningful. Special events like Baptisms and Marriages will have fewer non-essential "trimmings". While the internet and social media are providing a new way of connecting to the Church, nothing can replace the physical gathering around the table of the Lord in the local parish. Thank you for choosing to come to Mass and being part of your own Christian community!

Guidelines: Wash your hands before leaving home for the Church and on

your return. Sanitize your hands on entering the church and as you leave. Consider wearing a mask / face guard while at Mass. "Please sit here" stickers have been installed to mark the spot where you or your family group should sit! Sit two metres away from all other persons or household groups. Make greater use of



our front seats. Observe respiratory etiquette while at church. Our churches are well ventilated and regularly sanitized thanks to the efforts of our sacristans, volunteer cleaners, and CE workers.
