### **Twenty-Fourth Sunday:** *We imitate God by forgiving others.*

*1st Reading:* How easy and instinctive it is to “nurse” anger or resentment. One way out is to remember your own vulnerability and weakness. “Do not bear your neighbour ill will.”

*Psalm 102:* A song that praises God’s merciful love.

*2nd Reading:* We can have a remarkable influence on others. Jesus altered the destiny of humanity through his resurrection from the dead.

*Gospel:* We must always (“7” meant completion or totality in the bible) make the effort to let go of resentment and show forgiveness. It liberates both the perpetrator and the victim from the shackles of hate. God has forgiven us a great deal (ten thousand talents is worth approximately \$200 million in today’s money). Ought not we cancel the little resentments (100 denarii was the worth of about 3 months’ work) we accumulate?
