Twenty-Seventh Sunday:

1st Reading: The Kingdom of God is like a vineyard: wonderful, beautiful, but also requiring work if it is to produce good fruit.

Psalm 79: The vineyard that is creation is under attack.

2nd Reading: Do not worry to excess; the God of peace is with you.

Gospel: God's envoys (the prophets) and even his own son, were rejected by the "chief priests and the elders of the people". Today's Gospel signals the break between the first Christians and Judaism. For Christians, Jesus is the "keystone" of the building that is God's kingdom.
