## Feast of the Baptism of the Lord:

1<sup>st</sup> Reading: Isaiah wrote six centuries before Christ when the people of Israel were exiles in the land of Babylon. The prophet announces that their tragedy was not the end: destruction was not the end. God's would send a Saviour who would make all things new. It is not for us to understand how God's will is delivered, but isn't it true that all bad things (including the Covid-19 crisis) will be eventually be resolved?

*Psalm: Is 6:2-6:* God presence is compared to refreshing / cleansing water. Our response is to spend some time with a grateful heart.

2<sup>nd</sup> Reading: When we are baptised we become God's children.

<u>Gospel:</u> John the Baptist knows that Jesus is the Son of God, and knows that he does not require his baptism of repentance. The baptism of Jesus marked the beginning of his public ministry when he came to be known as Good's beloved Son.

The Custom of "Chalking the Door" is a popular tradition in for Catholics in parts of Europe, to ask God's blessing and protection for the year ahead (needed more than ever in our current circumstances). Using a piece of white chalk, the following formula is written on the lintel or frame of the front door:

## 20 + C + M + B + 21

The digits refer to the year, 2021. The letters are often read as Caspar, Melchior, Balthasar, the names that tradition gives to the Wise Men. It is really an abbreviation for Christus Mansionem Benedicat (May Christ bless this house)

**Pope Francis has nominated Dermot Farrell,** the current bishop of Ossory (Kilkenny/ Laois) as the next Archbishop of Dublin and Primate of Ireland. He will take up the appointment in February. Earlier this week he was interviewed by *The Irish Times* ... On Church decline and the crisis of vocations: "It is a crisis. We should always remember the Church was born in a crisis. Crisis is different to conflict, we shouldn't be afraid of it because it maybe prompting us to examine the way we do things and see if we can do things differently and have the courage to do so."

It "has to be addressed through prayer. Maybe we need to work with smaller groups of people who are more committed. Teaching people about prayer - I don't think we've been good at that in the past. We really didn't form people in prayer. Prayers ended up being the recitation of a formula...A deeper prayer life is important alongside the reading of sacred scripture."
