## Fifth Sunday of the Year: Our faith in Christ make us free to serve.

 $l^{st}$  Reading: The Book of Job describes the drudgery of life ("Relentlessly I fret till twilight falls."). Over the course of his story of gain and loss in life, Job lerns to put his trust in the Lord. When we hand over our worries to God, life is experienced as a gift.

Psalm 146: The Lord is our healer; in God each of us called by name.

 $2^{nd}$  Reading: The Gospel is a gift, but it is also a responsibility. St Paul invites us to share its blessings by putting other people first.

*Gospel*: A day in the life of Jesus. It begins the evening before (as is the Jewish custom) with Jesus healing Simon's mother-in-law. It continues the next day with more healing of the sick and preaching God's Word. But Jesus also makes time for prayer "in the morning, long before dawn." It was there, in the Galilean countryside that Jesus addressed God as "Abba", Father. May our good actions reflect the relationship we, too, have built up with our loving God.

**Next Thursday, February 11**, is the World day of Prayer the Sick, an annual commemoration begun by St John Paul II, in the years following the assassination attempt on his life. That attempt on his life permanently damaged the Pope's health, but also gave him a sense of solidarity with the sick. Illness is a time of trial, but it can also be an experience of God's grace. The annual day of prayer was inaugurated in 1992 at Lourdes in the grotto where the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to Bernadette Soubirous on February 11, 1858. Since the founding apparition, Lourdes has become a place of pilgrimage for groups from around the world, including our own diocese. This year we remember all who are sick as a consequence of Covid19. *Our Lady of Lourdes, pray for us.* 

While this year's Cloyne Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes is cancelled; owing to the pandemic, the annual pilgrimage diocesan Mass will be celebrated in the Church of The Immaculate Conception, Kanturk at 7.30pm.
