

Sixth Sunday of the Year: *Jesus, friend to outcasts.*

1st Reading: In the ancient world, leprosy was the most dreaded of all diseases. The book of Leviticus specifies that the person who contracted the fatal illness should be separated from the community. .

Psalm 31: *To acknowledge our guilt and express sorrow for our sins opens the gates to God's mercy.*

2nd Reading: When we give glory to God, it naturally follows that we will respect others. "I try to be helpful to others at all times." (St Paul)

Gospel: To the consternation of the people of his time, Jesus reached out and touched a leper, the outcasts of that era. There are no limits to his compassion and his desire to bring healing. Who are the outcast of our times? Or what part of our lives have we rejected? Jesus invites us to reach out in compassion and a desire to heal.

Lent 2021: The season of Lent begins next Wednesday, February 17 and will continue until Wednesday of Holy Week (March 31). Unfortunately, we are unable to gather this year to mark the beginning of this great season of grace when we take up the call to turn back to the Lord with all our hearts. Traditionally, we had our foreheads marked with ashes in the Sign of the Cross as the minister said:

Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel

This year we are unable to be marked by ashes in our churches. Instead, we are each being invited to mark the day with a prayer service in our own homes. The diocese of Cloyne has compiled one option for such a prayer service. Copies are available at both churches and can also be located in the Events section of the www.killavullenparish.ie website (or in the calendar tab, click on February 17). The prayer service invites us think about how we might make an extra effort in three areas of spirituality:

- **Prayer:** by making time for spoken prayer, meditation and the bible.
- **Fasting** from non-essential foods or other aspects of our lives we could well do without, such as social media or alcohol, smoking, etc.
- **Almsgiving** – as a sign of gratitude for all that we have, we are invited to share our resources with those less well off.

The annual **Trocaire Box** is one way of combining fasting and almsgiving: we are invited to donate the saving we make by cutting down on treats to the box and then contribute the proceeds to Trocaire. This year's Trocaire campaign focuses on the people of South Sudan. The boxes are available from both churches.
