Second Week of Easter (April 11-17, 2021)



Second Sunday of Easter Zoom Mass from Ballygriffin at 10.00am

1st Reading: A description of the four cornerstone activities in the earliest Church: learning the teaching of the apostles (the didachē); the community (koinonia); prayers (primarily in their own domestic settings) and the "breaking of bread", Luke's characteristic phrase for the eucharist.

Psalm 117: A song of praise for all that God has done to liberate Israel. Second Reading: We share in the victory of Christ over sin and death by keeping the commandments.

Gospel: Today's Gospel is especially appropriate this year, since, like the disciples we are locked away in fear and foreboding owing to an apparent disaster. The risen Jesus appears among us to invite that we open the locked doors of our lives and trust in his power to save us. We need not await the lifting of the restrictions to experience this type of liberation. "Doubt no longer, but believe."
