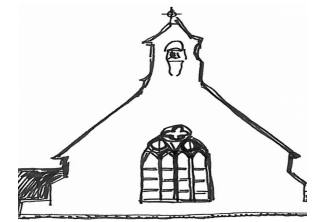

### Trinity Sunday

*1<sup>st</sup> Reading:* Moses believed and proclaimed a God who does more than just exist, but actively intervenes to help and save his people. Creation will prosper when we keep God's commands.

*Psalms 32:* The Lord is the shield of those who place their hope in him.

*2<sup>nd</sup> Reading:* The Holy Spirit makes us God's sons and daughters alongside Christ: with Jesus we can call God "Abba", the informal word ('daddy') for "father" in Aramaic.

*Gospel:* The disciples worship Jesus as God's only Son and embark on the journey of sharing the Good News, "though some hesitated." Faith and mission depend on our own cooperation and commitment.

### **Welcome back to Mass! Measures to ensure Covid-safety**

- Please observe best hygiene practices, including hand sanitization on entering the church and wearing a face mask or shield. Sit with your family unit on one of the designated green stickers and 2 metres apart from other individuals / households.
- Attendances are limited to 50 at each Mass, including funerals and weddings. Baptisms are limited to ten people.
- The style of the liturgy is simplified, without Altar Servers or an Offertory Procession. Communion may only be received on the hand. At the Sign of Peace greet others with a friendly smile or a non-tactile gesture.
- The churches are being fully ventilated, so dress warmly!
- The obligation for Catholics to attend Sunday Mass continues to be suspended. You might attend Mass on another day of the week if you do not feel comfortable coming to Sunday Mass at this time.
