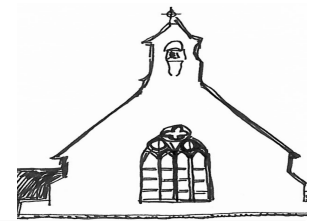


Parish of Killavullen and Annakisha 21.26

Thirteenth Sunday *The Lord upholds our life forever.*

1st Reading: The Book of Wisdom is one of the few parts of the Old Testament that portrayed a positive view of the afterlife. Up to then the afterlife was a shadowy existence called *Sheol*. Wisdom's teaching is based on belief in a loving God who honours and saves us. Death was not part of God's original plan for creation

Psalms 29: The Lord rescues us from all our distress

2nd Reading: When we are generous with our resources, time and talents we will lack for nothing.

Gospel: Jesus restores life to the daughter of Jairus. He shows the power of God over death. He compares death to sleep. Every time we hand our lives over to God, we can do so in the knowledge that life is safe in God's hands.
