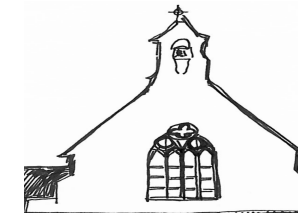

Permanent Diaconate: There are currently nine permanent deacons in our diocese and a programme of preparation for new deacons will begin in September. There is a letter from Bishop Crean on the diaconate at church notice-boards.

Buildings' report: Our thanks to Killavullen Art Group who are sponsoring the refurbishment of the floor of the Nano Nagle Porch at Killavullen. Natural 4-inch tiles will be used to create a Jerusalem Cross design in the floor. **At Annakisha** work is about to commence of repair to the parapet of the sacristy roof; a repointing of the exterior wall of the sacristy will also be undertaken.

Tom Barry Memorial at Annakisha: Cork County Council Commemorations Committee has offered the parish a 70% grant towards the cost of restoring the monument, with particular attention to the badly corroded railing.
