1st Reading: Elisha the prophet, a forerunner of Christ, shares bread with the people in a sign of God's blessing.

Psalms 144: A psalm of praise for the ways God blesses those who call on his name.

2nd Reading: Please live a life worthy of your Christian calling! Bear with others in a tolerant way.

Gospel: For the next six Sundays we take a break from the continuous reading of Mark's Gospel, to reflect with the Gospel of St John on the meaning of the Eucharist. Jesus feeds the crowds who were hungry. He nourishes us, too, with his presence when we gather around his table.

Tom Barry Memorial at Annakisha: Cork County Council Commemorations Committee has offered the parish a grant towards restoring the monument, subject to our local contribution. Please contact Fr Gerard if you would like to make a donation. "It is hard to say whether it was in the paths of war or in the paths of peace, whether it was by his undaunted spirit as a fighter, or by his sound sense and ability as an administrator in the local government of the country, that Tom Barry did the greatest service to his country." William O'Brien MP, speaking at the unveiling of the monument at Annakisha on August 19, 1906.

Message of Pope Francis for the Inaugural World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly: "Old age is a time of grace, in which the Lord renews his call to us: he calls us to safeguard and transmit the faith, he calls us to pray, especially to intercede; he calls us to be close to those in need....
