## <u>Twenty Second Sunday</u> The commandments that bring life.

*I<sup>st</sup> Reading:* Moses and the people of Israel have completed the 40-yearlong Exodus and from Egypt and reached their goal of the Promised Land. Moses gives them one last summary of the lessons they have learnt from their journey: so long as they keep the commandments, they will flourish. Doing so also brings wisdom, prudence and strength.

Psalm 14: The good person will reach the mountain of the Lord.

 $2^{nd}$  Reading: We can live our religion by helping the poor and the needy. Gospel: Jesus calls for sincerity of heart. The Pharisees were the leading religious figures of the Jewish faith in ther First Century. They were incredibly devout and dedicated to their religion, living the minutiae of the 613 commandments that they observed in the Bible. But they had lost their way in the details and forgotten the bigger picture of loving God and others.
