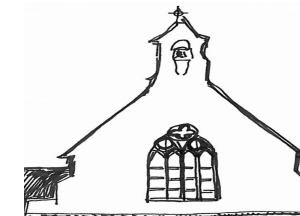

Twenty Fifth Sunday *Christ the Son of God*

1st Reading: Jesus is the wisdom of God made flesh. His message of patient trust in God was already present in this reading from the Old Testament.

Psalms 53: A prayer for God's assistance, when the world turns against us.

2nd Reading: Conflict with others often begins from within ourselves. The "wisdom that comes down from above" creates a larger perspective on life and helps us to find that inner peace which also helps our relationships.

Gospel: Achievement, fame and celebrity status are nice when they come our way. But if we make them into a personal goal and use our ambition to achieve them, then we will create conflict. Jesus reminds his disciples that true greatness lies in the service of others. All of the truly great people in our lives have assisted us without looking for recognition.
