Twenty Eighth Sunday Christ our true anchor.

1st Reading: Wisdom is a reflection of God's presence in the world – it is better to have wisdom than wealth.

Psalm 89: Life is fleeting; it is God who underpins our existence.

2nd Reading: God's Word is alive and active in the world. It keeps presenting itself to us, even if it is ignored or rejected.

Gospel: Wealth was seen as a sign of God's blessing in ancient times, as it is today. Like the disciples we might be taken aback by the teaching that it can also be an obstacle to faith. The young man who encountered Jesus was living a good and holy life; it was just that he needed to put his resources to better use in the service of God's kingdom.
