<u>Twenty Ninth Sunday</u> Christ, the servant of God..

1st *Reading:* The suffering servant of Isaiah. Any pain, suffering or time of loss in our lives is something we would naturally want to avoid. But it can also be a time when we lead ourselves, and others, back to God.

Psalm 32: The Lord upholds those who keep the faith.

 2^{nd} Reading: We can make our approach to God through Christ in whose priesthood we all have a share.

Gospel: The last verse of today's text is regarded by scripture scholars as the *ipsissima verba Iesu* – his own and original words. Jesus saw himself as the one who would lead us back to God by laying down his own life. When we serve others, rather than ourselves, we are following the Gospel.

Covid-19 guidelines are expected to be reviewed next week and may be eased from October 22. Parishes will continue to observe the public health recommendations that hinder the spread of the virus. The upcoming Synod calls for greater *communion* with Christ, *participation* in the life of the Church and a share in its mission. *Consider taking a more active part in Church life once restrictions are lifted:*

- Altar Servers (4th to 6th Class): Every second weekend in teams of 2.
- **Minister of the Eucharist:** At Sunday Mass and/or to bring a communion to a housebound person who is a close contact.
- John Paul II Award: For young adults (aged 16+) who volunteer a regular service to their parish and community over the course of a year.
- Children's Liturgy of the Word Leader: At church meeting rooms.
- **Parish Choir:** Will practice on Monday evenings in Killavullen Church and sing at the 11.30am Mass. Contact: Fiona Hannon or Cathy Dingavan
