### **Thirty Second Sunday** *The Lord rescues us from all our distress*

**1<sup>st</sup> Reading:** The prophet Elijah is on a journey and is shown hospitality by a poor widow and her son, even though they had practically nothing. Their generosity brought them many blessings, a so-called prophet's reward.

**Responsorial Psalm 145:** The Lord raises up those whose spirit is crushed by difficult circumstances in life.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Reading:** Christ's sacrifice brought about a new era for all of humanity.

**Gospel:** The story of the widow's mite: she had very little (approximately 1c in today's money) but that was her all. Jesus challenges those who have been richly blessed in life to be generous with our time, our talents and resources. "To those who are given much, much will be expected."

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**November: Is a month dedicated to remembering the dead.** The fallen leaves remind us of our mortality and the passing nature of life. Yet we know that the world of nature has not died, it is just at rest. The seeds and bulbs that have been planted in the ground will burst into new life next Spring. Shortly after Easter Sunday, St Peter told a crowd in Jerusalem that "death could not hold Jesus" – his tomb was empty, he was born into new life. We can visit the grave of a loved one (or a stranger) and know that death cannot hold them. By God's grace and mercy, made visible in Jesus, they have been born into new life.
