Thirty Third Sunday *God's love for creation spans through time & history*

1st Reading: The Book of Daniel was written when Israel was at a low ebb. It expresses the belief that God's justice would be made visible at the end of time: those who have lived good and holy lives will shine as bright stars.

Responsorial Psalm 15: True happiness is found when we honour the presence of God in our lives. "You will show me the path of life."

2nd Reading: The life, death, and resurrection of Christ changed the course of human destiny. In him we have been reconciled with God and one another.

Gospel: With the approach of his own death in Jerusalem, Jesus also reflects on the end of time. Our trust in God helps us not to be scared by the passage of time: God's Word does not pass away.
