<u>Sunday of the Word of God</u> At the Opening of this Sunday's Masses we will have a short ritual for the enthronement of the Bible.

1st Reading: The people of Israel returned to Jerusalem and reopened the Temple after a 50-year absence. It was an emotional experience as Ezra, the High Priest, proclaimed the Scriptures in public again. The people felt the presence of God in the proclamation of the word.

 2^{nd} Reading: The Christian community at Corinth was suffering division and strife. St Paul argues that though all the parts of the human body perform different functions, they must all to work together. The Body of Christ, too, needs all our talents.

Gospel: A powerful moment in the story of Jesus. After being declared God's beloved Son at his baptism in the river Jordan, he returns to native Nazareth. The people of the city can only see the human face of Jesus; they do not accept him as the new Messiah, the one sent by God to deliver salvation.

Respect: The death of Aishling has "asked questions of ourselves and of society. It has questioned our attitudes and, particularly, our attitudes towards women and it has questioned our values and our morality. Whether those questions will be addressed or passed over remains to be seen but we cannot allow such violence and disregard for both human life and bodily integrity take root in our time and culture. Pope Francis in his homily for New Year's Day said that violence against women was an insult to God. We all know that no individual should die like Ashling and no family should suffer like Ashling's. Respect is an old-fashioned word but it is an important one. Respect was missing last Wednesday but it has re-emerged here all the stronger.
