**Recessional:** Christ be near at either hand, Christ behind, before me stand. Christ with me where e'er I go. Christ around, above below. Christ my life and only way. Christ mv lantern night & day. Christ be my unchanging friend. Guide and shepherd to the end.

**Second Sunday of Lent** Faith makes oour life shine with God's glory. 1st Reading: The story of our faith begins with Abraham who acknowledged the existence of the one true God when he stared up at the stars one night. Abraham puts his faith in the God he cannot see, but whose covenant brings many blessings. Responsorial Psalm 26: Those who hope in the Lord will see God's goodness. 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading: Our true homeland is heaven; there we will have a glorious body. Gospel: The transfiguration reveals the divine nature of Jesus to the inner group of his disciples (who would also be with him at the Garden of Gethsemane). In the vision, Jesus stands alongside Elijah (representative of the Old Testament prophets) and Moses (the bringer of the Torah/Law)
