Easter Sunday We are an Easter people; Alleluia (He is Risen) is our song. 1st Reading: Peter addresses the people of Israel with the kerygma (the proclamation) of the Good News.

Responsorial Psalm 117: A song of praise to God. We praise the Lord for conquering death in the resurrection of his Son. He was the stone rejected by the builders that became the cornerstone of a new covenant with God.

 2^{nd} Reading: The Good News moves our hearts and minds to heavenly things. Through our baptism, we are "hidden with Christ in God."

Gospel: Peter and John hear the Good News from Mary Magdalene. The empty tomb provided sure evidence for the resurrection.

Buildings in our Parish: (from, *The Buildings of Ireland, Cork City and County,* by Frank Keohane (Yale University Press, 2020):

Church of St Nicholas, 1839, possibly by Michael A Riordan*. A big five-bay hall with rounded head windows set in blind recesses. Three-bay pedimented façade with a round-headed tripartite window and a bellcote and blind flanking bays with shallow arched recesses. Plain interior with Corinthian columns flanking the chancel, which was remodelled c.1994 and now resembles a conservatory. Stained Glass, St Patrick and Sacred Heart by Watson & Co. (Youghal) erected "in memory of the late Tom Barry".

*Michael Augustine Riordan (1783-1848), born in Doneraile, worked as an architect and builder before joining the Christian Brothers and subsequently the Presentation Brothers at Douglas Street in Cork. Designed and built numerous churches in the dioceses of Cork, Cloyne and Kerry.
