Buildings in Our Parish: (from *The Buildings of Ireland, Cork City and County, by Frank Keohane, Yale University Press, 2020): Killavullen Bridge:* Early 1800s. Made up of three wide handsome semi-circular arches.

Ballymacmoy House: A Regency-style house built c.1818 for James Hennessy, scion of the French cogna-roducing dynasty, on a cave-riddled cliff above the Blackwater. Three bays, with smooth-rendered walls, low hipped roofs and numerous tri-partite windows. A bow-fronted, two-storey mid-1800s wing to the right contains a larger drawing room.
