Fourth Sunday of Easter (Good Shepherd Sunday)

1st Reading: Many of the Jewish coverts to Christianity did not accept the universalist view of the Gospel: that the Good News was for all people, Gentiles (pagans) as well as Jews. This debate continued in the early Church until 50AD. when, at the Council of Jerusalem, the views of Paul and Barnabas were agreed. *Psalm:* We are God's people, the sheep of his flock.

 2^{nd} Reading: In heaven, as on earth, the praise of God is sung. The saints include the martyrs who have been persecuted or died for their faith.

Gospel: Jesus is the Good Shepherd. On this, Vocations Sunday, we pray that the Lord will continue to send shepherds to the Church. May there be priests, religious brothers and sisters, who will dedicate their lives to God and for service of others.

Tom Barry Monument at Annakisha: Scaffolding will be erected around the monument this week and a biocide applied to its surface in preparation for the cleaning of the structure over the coming weeks. The restored railing will then be reinstalled. On June 12, from 3.00-4.30pm an event will take place at Annakisha to mark the renovation. Micheál Magner will speak on the life of Tom Barry (1850-1904); Barry Linehan will recount events from the Civil War in the area and Graham Hull will present the findings of a recent archaeological dig at Annakisha. The events of August 19, 1906 will also be recalled: William O'Brien MP and the Thomas Davis Pipe Band led a procession of thousands from Mallow to Annakisha Church, on that day, for the unveiling of the monument. The same band will be present on June 12. Mr Conor Nelligan, the Cork County Heritage Officer will cut the ribbon on the restored monument. Donations towards the 20% local contribution to the restoration project will be welcome.
