Tom Barry Monument at Annakisha: On June 12, from 3.00-4.30pm an event will take place to mark the renovation of the monument, presently underway. Micheál Magner will speak on the life of nationalist politician Tom Barry (1850-1904); Barry Linehan will recount a local events from the Civil War (1922) and Graham Hull will present the findings of a recent archaeological dig at Annakisha. Nora Moroney will present vignettes from local lore and history. The Thomas Davis Pipe Band which played at the original unveiling on August 19, 1906 will again be present at Annakisha on June 12. Mr Conor Nelligan, the County Heritage Officer will cut the ribbon on the restored monument. Donations towards the 20% local contribution to the restoration project are welcome.
