

Ascension Sunday

1st Reading: Forty days after the resurrection, the risen body of Jesus ascends to the Father in heaven. The disciples are left looking on in wonder. An angel reminds them that the Lord is still with them through the gift of the Spirit and they are to be his new body in the world.

2nd Reading: The Christ has entered heaven and brought all of creation to a new relationship with God. God has rich glories in store for each of us.

Gospel: The disciples are filled with joy because they have come to know the Lord. He “passes on the baton”, sending them out to share the Good News.

Next weekend (June 4-5) we celebrate Pentecost Sunday, the end of the Easter Season and the birthday of the Church, when the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples making them courageous witnesses to Jesus. We invite those recently Confirmed with the gift of the Holy Spirit to attend any of the Masses that weekend. The Vigil Mass will include Evening Prayer; the 11.30am Mass, that Sunday, will be celebrated at Nano Nagle Birthplace. Following Mass, tea/coffees will be available; you are invited to bring your own food for a family “tailgate” party picnic, weather permitting.

Tom Barry Monument at Annakisha: The cleaning of the monument has been carried out Eoghan Daltún Sculpture Conservation this week; Conor Hannon will now carry repoint the monument with a lime-based mortar and the restored railings will be installed in time for the unveiling on **June 12. You are invited to attend from 3.00-4.30pm that afternoon**, when local historians will speak on the life of Tom Barry (1850-1904); an incident from the War of Independence that occurred at nearby Lisanisky in 1921; and the results of the archaeological dig conducted by TVAS in advance of the long anticipated road realignment of the N73: *5,500 years of Human Activity at Annakisha*. Nora Moroney will present vignettes from local lore and history. The Thomas Davis Pipe Band, which played at the original unveiling of the monument on August 19, 1906 will again be present. The restored monument will be unveiled by Conor Nelligan, the County Heritage Officer. *Donations towards the 20% local contribution to the restoration project are welcome.*
