## <u>*Twenty Sixth Sunday*</u> The Lord hears the cry of the poor.

1<sup>st</sup> *Reading:* The prophet Amos preached against the lifestyle of the rich and powerful of his day, even as the society around them crumbled. It is not hard to spot the parallels with our times, over 2,500 years later. The poor and the planet's environment is paying the price of an economy based on greed and exploitation.

 $2^{nd}$  Reading: Paul advises Timothy to persevere in the faith with strength, but at the same time to be "patient and gentle". We witness to Christ above all by the example of our lives.

*Gospel:* In the parable, the poor man, Lazarus, is comforted in heaven, while the rich man (who is not given a name) suffers torment and affliction. It's a reversal of the fortune that he once enjoyed in his earthly life.

**Notes on Parish History VIII** (by Nora Moroney). *Annakisha Church:* The site was acquired from Captain WJ Hamilton of Castle Hamilton, who had come into the possession of the Nagle's estate at "Annakissy", is it was then called, under the Encumbered Estates Court. The Buckley Family, who were his tenants and farmed the land in the area also signed the Deed of Conveyance on June 2, 1858. This document is presently in the Diocesan Archive in Cobh. The Parish Priest of Killavullen, Pierce Greene and Bishop William Keane, signed on behalf of the Diocese of Cloyne. Annakisha Church was originally planned to be built South of its present site at Torpy's Cross. However, Mr Edward Hoare-Reeves of Castlekevin objected on the grounds that the sight of a Catholic church at the crossroads would upset him as he travelled to his own place of worship at Clenor Church of Ireland.
