Thirtieth Sunday *God listens to the voice of the humble.*

1st Reading: Widows and orphans had the least rights in ancient Israel. Yet they are the same as “personages” in the sight of God. All that God requires of us is virtue and humility.

2nd Reading: Paul writes to Timothy from his prison cell shortly before his martyrdom in 62-64AD. He has run the race to the end and kept the faith.

Gospel: A parable about prayer. The Pharisee, a religious leader of his time, is calling attention to himself, not God. The tax collector, a traitor to his own people and an outcast, directs his attention to the Lord. Our prayer should be focused on God’s mercy.
