Thirty First Sunday *God listens to the voice of the humble.*

1st Reading: The Lord God loves all that exists; Even when we sin, God still loves us: "little by little, you correct those who offend."

2nd Reading: St Paul's letter to the Thessalonians was among the earliest writings of the New Testament, perhaps dating to 49AD. The people expected an imminent Second Coming of Christ ("Day of the Lord").

Gospel: The story of Zacchaeus begins with his distant curiosity in God (he climbs a sycamore tree: see www.sycamore.fm) and ends with his experience of salvation. It is Jesus to takes the initiative. In between comes Zacchaeus' repentance for his sins and his offer to make amends.

and he prays in me, Walk, walk, in the light.

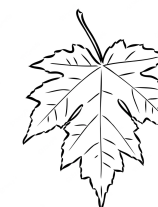
