Thirty Second Sunday

Christ our hope of life eternal.

1st Reading: The book of Maccabees describes the persecution of a Jewish family and their martyrdom. They remained true to their faith because of their belief that God would raise them to new life.

2nd Reading: St Paul prays that the Lord will strengthen the Thessalonians in their good work. Our faith brings us comfort, direction and strength.

Gospel: The Sadducees did not believe in the resurrection and make an argument to Jesus to discredit that belief. Jesus affirms the existence of an afterlife, but goes on to say that it is an existence beyond our understanding. A loving God does not want our existence to end at the conclusion of this life. By the resurrection of his Son, we have been called to new life.

Notes on Parish History XI (by Nora Moroney): When Annakisha Church was nearing completion (in 1861) a controversy arose as to whom the Church would be dedicated. The locals had a great devotion to St Craebhnait. Fr Pierce Greene PP, however, wanted the church dedicated to St William. One day, about this time, Fr Greene was riding home from Mallow when his horse suddenly bolted and threw him to the ground. He took this as a sign from St Craebhnait of her displeasure and he made up his mind to adhere to the local people's wishes after all. And so, the church was dedicated to St Craebhnait.
