Thirty Second Sunday *Christ our hope of life eternal.*

1st Reading: The prophet Malachi describes the day of judgement as a decisive moment in world history. Evil-doers will be reduced, while those who have put their trust in the Lord will be saved.

2nd Reading: St Paul encourages everyone in the community to share their responsibilities fairly.

Gospel: The Gospel of Luke was written shortly after the destruction of the Temple of Jerusalem in 70AD: All of Jerusalem had been laid to waste by a Roman army, with “not a single stone left on another”; The first Christians were also being persecuted as the Gospel was written (“You will be hated on account of my name.”). Whatever the challenging circumstances of our world, we are invited to remain faithful to the Lord Jesus.

Notes on Parish History XII (by Nora Moroney): The bell at Annakisha Church is dedicated to St William. Its installation, in the late 1860s, was opposed by the local landowner, Edward Hoare Reeves of Castle Kevin. He thought that the addition of a bell to the church would not be acceptable to the non-Catholics in the area. Fr Greene is said to have informed him that the bell would be heard as far away as Drochda na nGabhar on the slopes of the Ballyhoura Mountains, but that he, Mr Reeves would not hear it in nearby Castle Kevin. As it happened, Mr Reeves died on April 24, 1867. Annakisha Church bell was not installed until the following year.
