Feast of Christ the King

1st Reading: A turning point in the history of Israel occurred when David was anointed king of Israel. His Hebrew title "Messiah" (in Greek "Christ") means "the anointed one". For Christians, Jesus is the new "anointed one" of God: sent to reconcile creation with God by his Good News and sacrifice. 2nd Reading: God has made a place for us in the in the Kingdom of the Son whom he loves.

Gospel: The image of Jesus dying on the cross, shows him to be a very different kind of king to those who have normally ruled humanity. He prays for those who have executed him; and he shows his human weakness rather than his divine power. By his death on the cross he has brought us into God's Kingdom. Justice, love and peace are its signs.

Children's worksheets on today's Gospel are at church doorways. A Children's Liturgy of the Word will take place at the 11.30am Mass.
