<u>New Year's Day</u> Feast of Mary, the Mother of God.

1st *Reading:* Towards the end of his life, on their arrival at the Promised Land, Moses imparts God's blessing on the people of Israel.

 2^{nd} Reading: Jesus was born of Mary to share fully our humanity. He has sent us his Spirit, poured into our hearts at baptism, so that we can call God, "Father". God became one with us, so that we could become more like God Gospel: The shepherds follow the instructions of the angels and find Jesus in a manger. They praise God. We, too, praise God, for the signs of his presence.
