

## **Third Sunday of the Year** (Sunday of the Word of God)

1<sup>st</sup> Reading: There are echoes of the Christmas season in this reading from Isaiah. The Messiah whose coming the prophet predicted would guide the people into God's kingdom by his wondrous light.

 $2^{nd}$  Reading: St Paul appeals for unity between Christians. In this week of prayer for Christian unity, we pray for reconciliation among the churches. Gospel: The beginning of Jesus' mission according to Matthew: his gospel sees in Jesus of Nazareth the fulfilment of the prophecy of Isaiah. Jesus invites those he meets to repentance (metanoia – a change in direction) toward God. He creates a community who will share in his work. So appealing did Jesus appear to them that they immediately left everything to follow him.

Cill an Mhuilinn / Killavullen from, Heritage Towns and Villages of County Cork (Heritage Unit, Cork County Council, 2022). Part 3/4

The 1842 Ordinance Survey Map names the village as "Killawillin", and shows a short main street with an extension south-east towards a bridge over the Ross River, a tributary of the Blackwater. At the Blackwater end of the street, the map shows a police station, a national school and a corn mill. The Catholic Church is a little distant to the west, at a fork in the road leaving the village. By 1900, the village is still within its earlier bounds, but by then the mill building is gone. The cast iron axle of the waterwheel that powered the mill survives today in the GAA grounds. Today the main street retains its character with terraces of two-storey 19<sup>th</sup> Century houses along both sides. A number of these have carriageway arches as well as traditional shopfronts. The width and straightness of the street suggests an element of planning in its original layout. Most of the older houses on Ross Street were single storey and have been replaced by modern buildings, save one.
