## Seventh Sunday of the Year

(Temperance Sunday)

1<sup>st</sup> Reading and Psalm: Being honest and straightforward with others helps avoid resentments taking root. We speak with compassion as well as truth.  $2^{nd}$  Reading: The Spirit of Christ, dwelling within, makes us temples of God's presence and joined together in the One Body of the Church. The factional interests among the Christians of Corinth betrayed that sense of unity. *Gospel:* Matthew compares the Old Testament with the Gospel of Jesus. The disciples of Jesus are invited to a new interpretation of the Law of Moses, one that goes the "extra mile", beyond the realm of justice and into mercy.
