## Fourth Sunday of Easter. Good Shepherd Sunday /

*First Reading:* Half-ways through the season of Easter we anticipate the story of Pentecost (the 50<sup>th</sup> day after Easter Sunday). The outpouring of the Holy Spirit gave fresh impetus to the disciples' belief in Jesus. *Second Reading:* Saint Peter summarises his understanding of the mission of Jesus: he was the "suffering servant" of Isaiah, whose self-sacrifice on the cross would win redemption for humanity.

*Gospel:* Sheep can easily get lost and are prone to many threats. Christ is the shepherd and the gatekeeper who protects the flock that is the Church and leads it to the source of true life.
