Sixth Sunday of Easter. The Spirit is our Advocate

First Reading: At his Baptism in the river of Jordan, the Spirit of God was made visible to Jesus in a new way. Likewise, in today's story about Baptism, the Spirit of God was revealed. When we are baptised we, too, receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Second Reading: Can you give reasons for the faith you hold? Thinking, reading and talking about religious faith, help us to grow in understanding of its meaning.

Gospel: The Holy Spirit will remind us of the commandments of Jesus, especially that we should love one another. Being so close to us, we need never feel alone. The Holy Spirit is our Advocate (Paraclete) who pleads our cause and brings us consolation and strength.
