**Feast of Corpus Christi** (*The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ*). First Reading: During the Exodus from Egypt to the Promised Land, God kept the people of Israel alive in the desert by giving them food (manna bread) from heaven. Christians see in the Eucharist the new manna from heaven Second Reading: St Paul's letter to Corinth includes one of the very earliest references to the Eucharist: it is our union with the risen Christ and it brings us into communion with one another.

Gospel: We can "draw life" from Christ trough the sacrament of his Body and Blood. The nourishment Christ gives us sustains us on our spiritual journey.
