Twenty Second Sunday: Our desire for God overcomes our hesitation First Reading: The prophet Jeremiah laments that his faith in God has brought him insult and persecution, and yet his vocation to holiness and to talk about God burns within him like a fire.

Second Reading: Doing what God wants can put us at odds with "the behaviour of the world around you." Our faith leads us to please God.

Gospel: Peter wants Jesus to be successful and powerful, and not a suffering Messiah. Jesus tells him that we must think according to the standards of God and not the world. He invites his disciples to put their trust in the Lord even as we take up our crosses. It is more important to have faith in God than to be a success in the eyes of the world.

Quotes from Laudato Si:

- Because all creatures are connected, each must be cherished with love and respect, for all of us as living creatures are dependent on one another. (n.42)
- Our insistence that each human being is an image of God should not make us overlook the fact that each creature has its own purpose. None is superfluous. The entire material universe speaks of God's love. Soil, water, mountains: everything is, as it were, a caress of God. (n.84)
- When we fail to acknowledge as part of reality the wroth of a poor person, a human embryo, a person with disabilities, it becomes difficult to hear the cry of nature itself; everything is connected. (n.117)
- The universe unfolds in God, who fills it completely. Hence, there is a mystical meaning to be found in a single leaf, in a mountain trail, in a dewdrop, in a person's face. The ideal is not only to pass from the exterior to the interior to discover the action of God in the soul, but also to discover God in all things. (n.233)
