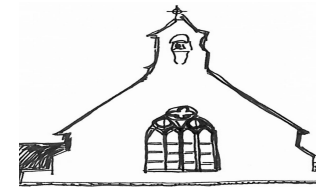


Parish of Killavullen and Annakisha
