This Sunday a Walk for Peace will take place on the Cycle Paths of the newly opened N73. The roadworks over the past year have coincided with the conflict in the Holy Land and now Lebanon. Over the past thirteen months, the UN Human Rights office estimates that 70% of the 48,000 fatalities in the Holy Land and Lebanon have been innocent women and children; 60% of the infrastructure of Gaza has been destroyed. Trócaire is one of the humanitarian agencies on the ground, assisting the victims, insofar as they are permitted by the IDF. We can express our solidarity with the victims and assist the work of Trocaire by taking part in today's event.

2.30pm: Prayer Service at Annakisha Church, with Trócaire Representatives.

3.00pm: Walk (on southbound cycle lane) and return to church.
