Feast of Saints Peter and Paul

First Reading: Saint Peter would imitate the Lord Jesus in his death by crucifixion (circa 66AD), but, as this incident from his life shows, he also evaded persecution for his faith in Christ. *The Lord is at our side to save us and leads us to freedom from all that imprisons us.*

Responsorial Psalm - A song which praises God who save us in our distress.

Second Reading: Saint Paul writes from his prison cell in Rome (circa 64AD); he has run the race to the end.

Gospel: Saint Peter professes his faith in Jesus as the Messiah, the anointed one sent by God to bring about a new covenant. Jesus tells Simon, Son of Jonah, that his new name is *Petrus* (meaning “rock”) and establishes the Church as a steadfast sign of the new covenant.

- The Sacrament of Reconciliation is celebrated on Saturdays at 6.30pm in the Reconciliation Room at Killavullen church.
- A Children’s Liturgy of the Word will take place at Masses *next* weekend.
